She co-wrote and produced the documentary play BREATHE WITH ME, which premiered at SPARKFest 2017. Her play OVER THE MOON was produced as part of DocFest in September 2018. GIANNI CARCAGNO (Production Assistant, COVID Compliance Officer) is excited to make her TimeLine debut with THE CHINESE LADY. Chicago credits include BLUES IN THE NIGHT, PUMP BOYS & DINETTES, NUNSENSE (Porchlight), LA CAGE AUX FOLLES and MAMMA MIA (Music Theater Works), MARY SHELLEY'S FRANKENSTEIN (Lookingglass), and POLAROID STORIES and THE BOYS AND THE NUNS (Loyola University Chicago). Gianni has a BA in Theatre and Sociology from Loyola University Chicago.

PJ POWERS (Artistic Director) was a co-founder of TimeLine in 1997 and became Artistic Director in 1999. Since then, he has overseen the production of more than 80 plays, including 11 world premieres and more than 38 Chicago premieres. During his tenure, TimeLine has garnered 58 Jeff Awards, including 11 for Outstanding Production, as well as awards for excellence in arts management, including the 2016 MacArthur Award for Creative and Effective Institutions. PJ also has

been instrumental in establishing TimeLine's home on Wellington Avenue in 1999; expanding the company's programming to include productions in numerous other venues, including the Broadway Playhouse; creating the TimePieces play reading series and First Draft Festival of new work; launching the Living History Education Program in Chicago Public Schools under the direction of TimeLine co-founder Juliet Hart; and planning for TimeLine's new home in Uptown, As an actor, he has appeared in 18 productions at TimeLine, including the apple family plays: That hopey changey THING, as well as THE FRONT PAGE, THE FARNSWORTH INVENTION, FIORELLO!, and HAUPTMANN. He also has appeared at Writers, Northlight, and Shattered Globe, among others. A graduate of The Theatre School at DePaul University, PJ has served on the Board of Directors for the League of Chicago Theatres, was awarded the Meier Achievement Award for mid-career artists, and received a Goldman Sachs Senior Fellowship at the Smithsonian National Museum of American History. He directed the Chicago premiere of J.T. Rogers' ONE GIANT LEAP: THE APOLLO 11 MOON LANDING in a one-night event at the Broadway Playhouse.

MICA COLE (Executive Director) was named TimeLine's new Executive Director in April 2022. A Chicago native raised on the South Side, she has worked as an arts administrator and changemaker for nearly two decades. Most recently, she has been a national consultant providing executive coaching and strategic planning for cultural institutions working to embrace an antiracist leadership paradigm. Mica is a consultant with artEquity, a nonprofit organization that provides tools, training, and resources for individuals and organizations working at the intersection of art and activism. She co-led its BIPOC Surviving Predominantly White Institutions Series and the BIPOC Leadership Circle—both aimed at providing resources and mentorship to leaders of color. Prior to her work as an organizational consultant, Mica served eight seasons as the Repertory Producer at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival. As a senior leader at OSF, she played a key role in guiding the company's equity, diversity, and inclusion initiatives, many of which now serve as foundational organizational models for institutions around the world. Mica has produced more than 80 shows, including a dozen transfers and national co-productions of new plays with theatres such as American Repertory. Seattle Repertory, South Coast Rep. Arena Stage, Portland Center Stage, and Berkeley Repertory. She worked in

Chicago as the Executive Director of Free Street Theater and as the Director of Education and Engagement at Writers Theatre. Mica served on the advisory committee for the Latinx Theatre Commons and is a founding member of the Black Theatre Commons. She is a graduate of The Theatre School at DePaul University.

DAN MCARDLE (Interim Managing Director) joined TimeLine as the company's first General Manager in 2014. Prior to TimeLine, he spent three seasons as Managing Director of The Neo-Futurists, producing more than 750 public events, overseeing numerous production extensions, expanding local touring efforts, and initiating new ticketing policies to stimulate financial security. Dan holds an MFA in Arts Leadership from DePaul University, where he combined coursework with a full-time fellowship at Chicago Shakespeare Theater. He recently concluded a six-year term serving on the Board of Directors for the League of Chicago Theatres, including three years as Treasurer. In Chicago, he also has held positions at Lookingglass Theatre, Theatre Seven of Chicago, and Goodman Theatre.

ELIZABETH K. AUMAN (Director of New Home Development) joined TimeLine Theatre as Managing Director in October 2007 and during her tenure oversaw a tripling of TimeLine's budget; the largest capital improvements in the company's history; extended runs of multiple shows; the expansion of TimeLine's programming to additional venues, most recently RELENTLESS at the Goodman and OSLO at the Broadway Playhouse: and multiple awards for excellence in arts management, including the 2016 MacArthur Award for Creative and Effective Institutions. She is now focused on managing TimeLine's project to develop our new home in Uptown. Prior to TimeLine, Elizabeth spent 15 years at Victory Gardens Theater, the last 12 as general manager, During that time, she helped guide Victory Gardens through major transitions and accomplishments, including budget growth from \$1.2 million to \$3 million, an \$11.8 million capital campaign, receiving the Tony Award for Regional Theatre in 2001, and the move to the Biograph Theater. She also has held administrative positions at Chicago Shakespeare and DePaul University's Blackstone Theatre (now the Merle Reskin Theatre). She has a BFA degree in Theater from Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington and was the recipient of Eclipse Theatre's 2010 Corona Award.

Open captioning is a text display of words and sounds heard during an event. The display is positioned in such a way that it is open for anyone to see in a particular seating area.

Open captioning is a service primarily provided for people with hearing disabilities who use assistive listening devices, hearing aids, cochlear implants, sign language, and lip reading. It is a service you may choose to use or ignore during the performance.

Audio Description

Audio description allows patrons who are blind or low vision to access the visual experience of our performances. A live narrator gives verbal descriptions of actions, costumes, scenery, and other visual elements via a handheld device delivered to patrons upon request before the show.

award for Outstanding Production 11 times.

LIVING HISTORY PROGRAM

earning and discovery have always been central to TimeLine's mission, driven by our belief that live performance can connect people and illuminate ideas.

Founded in 2006, TimeLine's Living History Education Program brings that mission to Chicago Public Schools, working with students on creative exercises related to historically inspired stories on TimeLine's stage and beyond.

Living History is an arts integration residency that features

curriculum designed to teach theatre skills while fostering the capacity to think creatively, to make connections, and to provide new ways of understanding history and the world around us. Over six to 13 sessions, students explore connections between history, art and their own lives, developing critical thinking and communication skills.

"It made me feel that I was part of that moment in history. As if I was experiencing it firsthand. It made me understand it better."

During Living History residencies, TimeLine teaching artists and classroom teachers collaborate on lesson plans that illuminate the themes of the play and their connection to each classroom curriculum. Students work on several scenes from a TimeLine production and are provided with a study guide. They experience visits from the production's actors and dramaturg and attend a student matinee and post-show discussion with the cast.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Living History revisioned its play- and field trip-centered residencies to respond to the unique needs of students and teachers who are living through history and looking for ways to express their experiences. The need for partnership, collaboration, and creative problem-solving is more important than ever, and Living History has provided virtual and real-time opportunities to use theater-based exercises to amplify student voices, challenges, hopes, and dreams.

Since its inception, more than 8,400 students have actively explored history through Living History. TimeLine currently partners with nine schools to present the program.

TIMELINE SOUTH

In 2018, Living History launched TimeLine South—a unique arts program that provides teens a safe space for self-expression, creativity, and ensemble building on the south side of Chicago. Offered free of charge for six weeks during the summer, TimeLine South promotes leadership in the arts and teaches teens that theatre can also be a vehicle for social justice.
